I want to share as a teachable moment something which I experienced recently. About two weeks, ago I received a call from someone about a proposed Zoom meeting. It was from a number I did not recognize (mistake number one.) But as a person somewhat in public service and with many persons having access to my personal cell, it didn't seem too much out of the ordinary. What was out of the ordinary was the person on the other line saying a code was sent to me and to please share (mistake number two.)

This was apparently used to access my WhatsApp platform. And, using that, attempted to approach my contacts for favors (aka, money!)

So as a precautionary tale, please be careful - especially at this time of year, when seemingly hackers and scammers abound even more. If you get a call from a number you don't recognize, let them leave a message. And whatever you do, never repeat a code sent to you by text. (In fact, lots of times the business sending you a legitimate code says, "Please don't share with anyone.") I've since changed my number and as far as I know, no one was affected by this breach. But it was very aggravating and embarrassing, to say the least.

At the same time I hope and pray this does not discourage you from generously supporting charities which do great good. The Rescue Mission of Trenton, Urban Promise, Angel Tree and Episcopal Community Services, are but a few.

May you and yours have a blessed Christmas and a blessed New Year 2024.

Partnership with ISLES

Trinity Cathedral is excited to partner with ISLES, (isles.org), in support of a Creation Care grant from the Episcopal Church national office. Founded in 1981 by a former member of Trinity Cathedral, ISLES is a successful and highly effective Trenton-based community development organization, operating with a mission of environmental stewardship. Their existing programs range from youth education and training, urban agriculture, promoting green and healthy living, climate action, and community revitalization.


The focus of the grant application will be the expansion of ISLES' Vegetarian cooking classes and will utilize the Cathedral's professional-grade kitchen facility. Reducing our meat consumption is the single most important act we can take to affect climate change, and the proposed program will address key environmental justice issues such as climate change resilience, food insecurity and wellness, and empowerment for environmental improvement and reduced carbon footprint. 
COP28

COP28, the 28th meeting of the annual United Nations climate summit is taking place in Dubai from November 30th through December 12th, when world leaders gather to work together on solutions to tackle climate change. Our prayers are needed in support of this critically important conference. The Episcopal Church sent a delegation of 21 members to COP28, including our own Cn. Barbie Bach. According to the Presiding Bishop's office the delegates will complete in-depth advocacy training and host public reports, discussions and events with a focus on environmental justice, ending environmental racism, and solving the climate crisis.

There was an Episcopal Church kickoff and prayer event on November 27th, and delegates will report back on their experiences during an online closing (open to all) at 3 pm EST, December 15th; please see The Episcopal Church website for registration details if you wish to join. Meanwhile, please pray for all our delegates and attending world leaders.

Healthy Women, Healthy Families Hosts Maternal Health Workshop







On Saturday, November 4, <u>Healthy Women, Healthy Families</u> hosted a workshop for birthing people, their families, and alternative caregivers on how to navigate perinatal addictions, and support those who may struggle with addiction during pregnancy and after birth. The workshop also addressed how to support new parents in the postpartum journey and navigate the baby blues and postpartum depression.

The afternoon was a collaborative effort, made possible through a partnership with our Cathedral. It featured an array of guest speakers who brought their expertise and insights to the forefront of maternal and child health. Notable speakers included Perinatal Addiction Specialist Roseann Cervelli, M.S., LCADC, CPS, CCS, and Pregnancy and Parenting Wellness Program Manager Kathy Donaldson, MSN, APN, C, WHNP-BC, PMH-C, RNC-OB, C-EFM. Their presentations shed light on crucial topics, such as the impact of substances like marijuana, fentanyl, and alcohol on pregnancy and postpartum, as well as the emotional journey that new mothers experience during the postpartum period, including the baby blues and postpartum depression.

The event was not only an educational opportunity but also a platform for real-life testimonials. Representatives from <u>Catholic Charities</u> shared their personal experiences with addiction and motherhood, underscoring the positive impact services and programs, like Healthy Women, Healthy Families, have on the lives of women and children. "I get to be a good role model to my daughter," said one participant, "thanks to God, this program, and this community." Their stories served as a powerful reminder of the importance of equitable access to services and programs, and their impact on keeping families together.

A diverse array of organizations was present at the event, including Catholic Charities, <u>Children's Futures</u>, Connecting NJ, Prematurity Prevention Initiative, <u>Prevention Coalition of Mercer County</u>, <u>Saint Michael's Episcopal Church</u>, and the <u>New Jersey Department of Health</u>. Global Grace Health of Highland Park, under the direction of Dr. Norma Bowe was also in attendance, providing Flu and Covid-19 vaccines for all in attendance. These organizations provided a plethora of materials advertising services and programs for families and children. This collective effort underscores Healthy Women, Healthy Families' commitment to improving maternal and infant health outcomes by bettering access to quality healthcare across the community.

Healthy Women, Healthy Families is closely aligned with First Lady Tammy Murphy's "Nurture NJ" initiative, which seeks to make New Jersey the safest state for giving birth. Their focus on education and resources for birthing individuals and their families exemplifies a shared commitment to the well-being of both the birthing parent and their loved ones. The program's dedication to these critical issues is a testament to the power of community collaboration and the pursuit of healthier futures for all.

Highlights of the November 2023 Major Chapter Meeting of Trinity Cathedral

Nineteen of the 26 members of the Major Chapter of Trinity Cathedral met via Zoom on Tuesday evening, November 14, at 6:30 pm. The Bishop called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm and offered the opening prayer. The main agenda items were addressed as follows:

<u>Financial Summary.</u> Treasurer Ron Zilinski presented a financial summary of the Cathedral's operations for 2023. To date, the income from pledges and trusts continues to be ahead of plan, bolstered by corporate matching gifts. Expenses are about as planned, except that employee fringe benefits are over by \$9k, having been billed and paid out a month in advance. The resulting deficit of \$108k in our operations as of the end of October is less than the \$112k deficit expected at this time of the year – enabling the possibility of no deficit at year end.

<u>Investments.</u> Cn. Paul Cooper presented a summary of the Cathedral's investments, which currently amount to \$2.25 million, 34% of which is in four funds of the <u>Diocesan Investment Trust</u> (DIT); 25% is mostly a recent bequest residing in a brokerage account; and the remaining 41% is in the <u>Dean Adams Trust</u> (DAT). Currently the DIT funds are yielding a 3.2% dividend annually; short term instruments in the brokerage account are earning 5%; and the DAT annually distributes 6.5% of its total value to the Cathedral.

<u>State of the Trinity Cathedral Academy (TCA).</u> The Dean reported for Academy Board Chair, Cn. Noreen Duncan. He said that all is well with the Academy, which continues to be managed successfully by Archdeacon Lynn Johnson, Academic Director.

<u>Property & Maintenance (P&M).</u> P&M Chair Michael Raab (guest) reported on projects that have been completed, including a) a new electric water heater for the Synod Hall kitchen, electrical and plumbing work in the main heater in the boiler room to supply hotter water to that kitchen and to the school – for a total of \$5,400; b) all approved gutter repair items for a total of \$8,525; c) roof maintenance (semi-annual) for \$1,559; and d) moats, cleaned by our in-house crew. He then presented a list of six ongoing issues and items involving garage roof repair, heat in the bathrooms, and Undercroft kitchen fire suppression system inspection.

<u>Fund Raising.</u> Dennie Higgins reported on our successful <u>Community Day</u>, which included our traditional Golf outing and dinner, and new Pickleball Clinics. The Bishop participated and was glad to be there. Future potential fundraisers include: a) <u>Tea for All</u> by Mike and Debbie Raab – with story-telling – to be held in February or March; b) the next concert in the <u>Cathedral Arts Series at Trinity</u> (CAST) with a performer; and c) a <u>Pumpkin Patch</u> event by Katherine Young.

<u>Social Justice/Episcopal Community Services (ECS).</u> Bobbie Powell and Cn. Clara Gregory hosted a *Conference on Women's Health* in Synod Hall on November 4 on maternal and child health. Flu and Covid vaccines were supplied. Other sessions are being held in Synod Hall on Trenton social justice topics such as *Creation Care*, for which an ECS grant is being sought. Katherine Young will put us in touch with the Merck for Mothers funding program for social justice projects; and asked about efforts to address the Israel war with Hamas. The Bishop and Dean will discuss how the Diocese can get involved beyond our support of the Diocese of Jerusalem.

<u>Dean's Report.</u> The Dean called attention to items in a report that he sent to the Chapter including: a) the Stewardship launch on November 12 with ECS Director the Rev. Trisha Thorme's message, reporting that 37 pledges totaling \$127k have been received, the goal being 100 pledges totaling \$300k; b) Livestream installation by Rob Bullington and Pete Cornell is almost complete, and they are advising operators Lee Whiteman and Tony Wootson; c) Lourdez with volunteer helpers is giving out 100 turkeys for Thanksgiving; d) *Community Day* having gone well, he is grateful for LaTonya Johnson, the organizing *Committee*, and participating Churches; e) Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady

of Częstochowa on October 21; g) Retirement of Michael Pettyjohn after 15 years with the Cathedral; h) Nancy Jackson bequest for Memorial Garden restoration; i) World Aids Day on December 1; j) Visit to Jackie Robinson Museum on December 8; and k) the *Emergency Safety Action Plan* prepared by Bobbie Powell and committee.

Bishop's Report. Bishop French presented her journal to date and her list of parish visitations. She will attend Cathedral Holy Week and Easter services. She announced the Nov. 17-18 Diocesan presentation and worship at the Cathedral on *Healthy Congregations* to be led by a guest speaker. She said the Special Convention to deal with the budget will take place on Friday evening and Saturday morning, Dec. 9-10. There will be two Diocesan Conventions in 2024 as we transition from having them in March and thereafter only in December. In 2024, we will renew in-person Cathedral activities for Deacons' Ordination Day in January, Confirmation Day, and March Lenten Clergy Day. She has been busy hiring her staff and catching up with congregations overdue for visitations. She would love to attend the pet blessings service at the Cathedral in the Spring. The Bishop then invited questions from Chapter members.


<u>Next Meeting.</u> The next meeting of the Major Chapter will take place on Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at 6:30 pm via Zoom.
