Celebrating Jackie Robinson Day

April 2024

On April 15, 1947, Jackie Robinson became the first African American to play Major League Baseball in the modern era and achieved Hall of Fame status. He later became the first African American to hold an officer-level position at a major corporation, served as an advisor to top politicians, actively promoted economic empowerment by co-founding a bank and a housing development company, and of course was a key figure in advancing equal justice and first-class

citizenship from the 1950s until his death in 1972. Hailed a "...freedom rider before freedom rides," Robinson's name has become synonymous with breaking barriers.

Jackie Robinson Day is a traditional event which occurs annually on April 15 in Major League Baseball (MLB), commemorating and honoring the day Jackie Robinson made his major league debut. Celebrated at MLB ballparks, on that one day, all players, coaches, and managers on both teams, and the umpires, wear Robinson's uniform number, 42.

The **Jackie Robinson Museum** celebrates the enduring legacy of one of the most important Americans of the 20th century, chronicling his trailblazing achievements against the backdrop of United States history. Invoking Robinson's role as a champion for

racial, social, and economic equality, the Museum's programming places an emphasis on dialogue around critical issues that continue to challenge our society.

We at the Cathedral were excited to participate in a group outing to the Jackie Robinson Museum in December of 2023, graciously hosted by our own La'Tonya Johnson, current Chair of the Bishop George E. Councell Memorial Golf Outing Committee and former Senior Warden of our Cathedral. La'Tonya is the Vice President and Chief Operating officer of the Museum.





Creation Care Corner

This month's Creation Care Corner features an update on recent activities and a look ahead to what's coming next:

- "Green" practices: The Cathedral is replacing traditional cleaning products used in our bathrooms, kitchens and elsewhere with environmentally friendly alternatives. This affects products such as traditional bleach, disinfecting spray, glass cleaner and floor cleaners. After completing a trial period with new eco-friendly alternatives, our sexton Al Shaw is fully onboard with the upgrade, and we look forward to this permanent improvement in the Cathedral's environmental footprint.
- Larry Spears is championing the use of ceramic tea and coffee cups during our Sunday morning coffee hour to replace cardboard (or worse, Styrofoam) coffee cups, which mostly go to landfill after use. Larry provides an adequate supply of ceramics cups each Sunday, and our dishwasher can easily handle the load. Please support Larry and our Creation Care efforts with this small ask. (The coffee and tea tastes better too!)
- The Cathedral's grant application to the Episcopal Church's Task Force on Creation Care
 and Environmental Racism was successfully submitted prior to the deadline on March
 22nd. If funded, the grant will support a joint project with Isles Inc¹ to address the
 inequitable and systemic impacts of environmental racism and social injustice in the
 underserved community of Trenton. Updates will be provided when available.
- Monday April 22nd is Earth Day. The global theme this year is "Planet vs. Plastics", with a goal of reducing plastic production by 60% by 2040. Plastics are a danger to both humanity and all living creatures. According to Earthday.org², 95% of all plastics in the US will not be recycled. As plastics break down into microplastics, they release toxic chemicals into our food and water sources and circulate through the air we breathe. The rapid phase-out of single use plastics is urgently needed.

Please look out for related activities at Trinity Cathedral, and an Earth Day theme on Sunday, April 21st.

Highlights of the Trinity Cathedral Vestry Meeting of March 18, 2024


Eleven of the fifteen members of the Vestry met virtually on Monday, March 18, at 6:30 pm, with the Dean presiding and offering the opening prayer. Treasurer Ron Zilinski presented a summary of the Cathedral's operations for the first two months of 2024. \$49k of budgeted income was due but not yet received. This largely explains why the bottom-line deficit is \$39k greater than the budgeted \$33k to date. The good news is that pledge income is \$22k more than planned. Total expenses were \$8k over budget, due mainly to the fact \$9k was paid in advance for the employee Fringe benefits for the month of March. Cn. Paul Cooper reported that the Cathedral's investments at the end of February total \$2.3 million, which is 4% greater than it was at the end of 2023. 20% of the total is mostly bequest money residing in a brokerage account, and \$307k of this amount is now being managed by the *Endowment Board*, which currently has charge of \$1 million or 44% of our total invested funds.

Senior Warden Gil Williams reported on Property & Maintenance as follows: Heaters have been installed in the bathrooms in the entrance hall to the building, and pipes have been replaced in the boiler for the school heating system. Technicians will be brought in to find and repair the leak in the wall in the area of the high window on the south side of the cathedral sanctuary. Also reporting on the Food Pantry for Lourdez Hernandez, Gil said that the numbers are up lately. He and other others such as Sam Richards load 115 bags on the Thursday afternoons preceding the Saturday distribution – serving 141 families. Enough food is provided by *Mercer Street Friends* to fill about 150 bags; so, they provide some of them to the Cathedral's Trenton Area Soup Kitchen (TASK) satellite volunteers for distribution to soup kitchen clients along with TASK's dinners.

The Dean said that this year will be the 20th anniversary of the Cathedral's Community Day/Golf Outing major fundraiser. Also, the *African Festival* is planned for October of this year. Bobbie Powell announced *CAST's* Jazz Concert on Friday, April 12 from 7 to 10 pm. The Dean reported further as follows: a) On social justice issues, he said that Episcopal Community Services sponsored the *Poor People's Campaign* rally marching to the State House on March 2nd; b) Also on March 2nd, Fr. Jeffrey Roy conducted the Vestry Retreat helping us plan for "what would make 2024 right." The impetus to organize the *Greeters* was one great result. Another has been the work of Andrea John and Hilary Cox getting young people involved as acolytes. More of us can do this kind of thing. In this regard, he thanked Georgia as well. c) He spoke of several funerals, one being for Hibbert Duncan, husband of Cn. Noreen Duncan; another being for Kendall Walton, Ruth Perry' daughter. d) He announced that Cn. Art Powell is taking over the flowers responsibility from Sue Remmers. e) Princeton Seminarian Angela de Joseph wants to serve at the Cathedral as part of her preparation for ministry. f) A team consisting of Althea Muse, Larry Spears, et al, will create and work in a program with the residents of Hamilton Grove Rehabilitation Center. Also, Larry and Joyce Spears do a great job with the *Fellowship Hour*.

Under the leadership of Deacon Chris Cox, the Creation Care Committee is promoting green cleaning products; wants to stop using paper cups; and is working on a grant with *Isles* to help neighborhood people learn about vegetarian cooking in the kitchen.




