




The Lord is my light and my sal - va - tion.




1. The Lord is my light and my salvation; *whom* then shall I fear?

a - against me, yet my heart shall not be a - fraid; 4. And though war




should *rise* up a - gainst me, yet will I put my trust in him. **Refrain**



5. *One* thing have I asked of the Lord; *one* thing I seek;

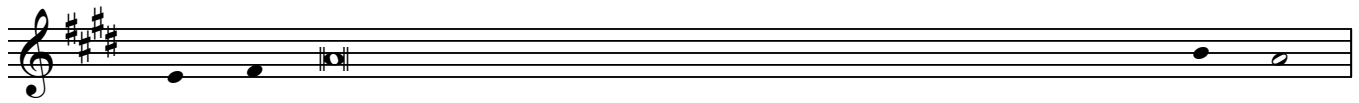


that I may dwell in the house of the *Lord* all the days of my life;

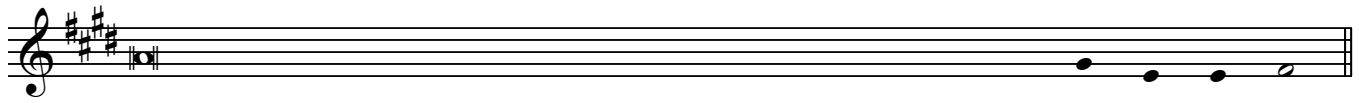


6. To behold the *fair* beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his tem - ple. **Refrain**

I will sing and *make* mu - sic to the Lord. 10. Hearken to my voice, O *Lord*, when I call;



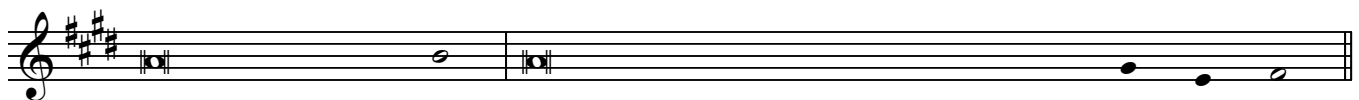
have mercy on me and an - swer me. **Refrain** 11. You speak in my heart and *say*, "Seek my face."



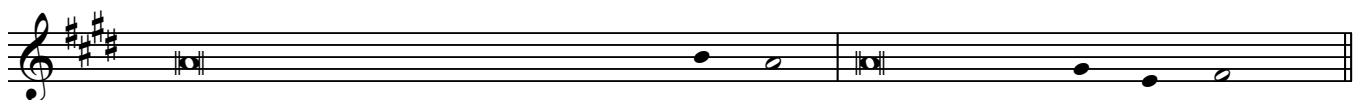
Your *face*, Lord, will I seek. 12. *Hide* not your face from me,



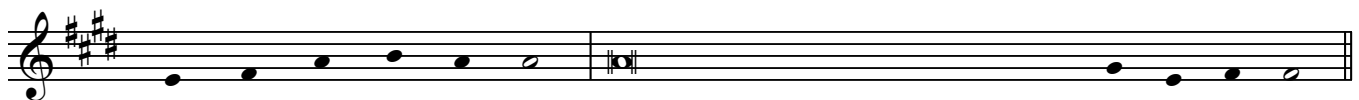

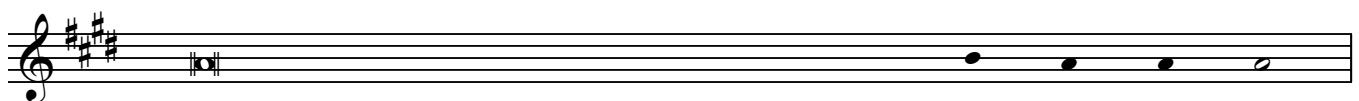

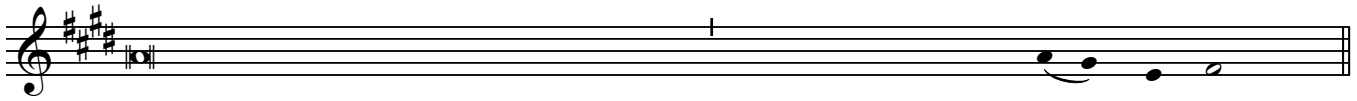

15. Show me your way, O Lord; lead me on a level path, because of my en - e - mies.



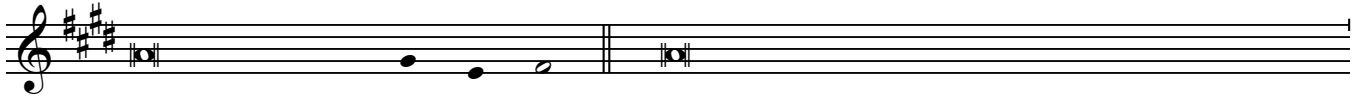
16. Deliver me *not* into the hand of my ad - ver - sa - ries,

in the land of the liv - ing! 18. O tarry and await the *Lord's* pleasure;

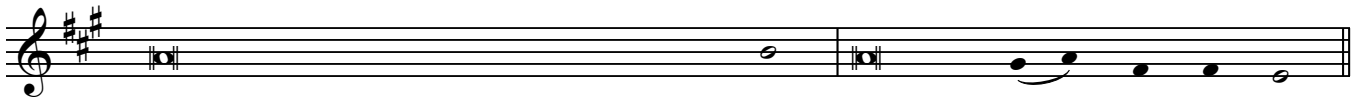


be strong, and he shall comfort your heart; *wait* patient - ly for the Lord. **Refrain**

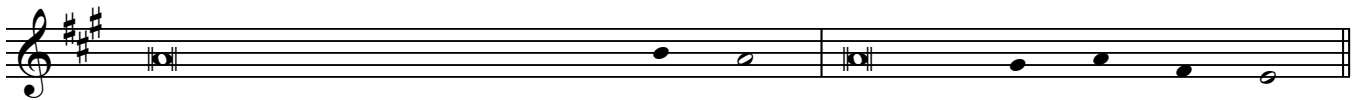
