Dear Friends,

I came across this wonderful meditation and found it most refreshing and appropriate to our time...

Refusing the Gift

by The Rev. Cameron Trimble

"Hatred does not cease by hatred, but only by love; this is the eternal law."

There's a story told of the Buddha and an angry man. The man came hurling insults, full of fury, demanding a fight. But the Buddha stood calm, rooted in stillness. When the man finally paused for breath, the Buddha said softly:

"If someone offers you a gift and you do not accept it, to whom does the gift belong?"

"To the one who offered it," the man replied.

"Exactly," said the Buddha. "So it is with your anger—I do not accept it. It remains yours."

There is deep wisdom here for our moment. We are living in a time of constant provocation. From degrading AI-generated propaganda to the destruction of public symbols, from political gaslighting to cultural erosion, the powerful seem intent on drawing us into their theater of rage, spinning us in cycles of outrage, fear, and despair. But not every gift must be received. Not every insult must be dignified with our energy. Not every performance deserves our participation.

To not receive the gift of contempt is a sacred act of resistance. It is not passivity. It is presence. It is choosing not to mirror cruelty. It is refusing to be governed by someone else's narrative of hate.

The empire may try to humiliate, distract, and dominate. But we do not have to carry what was never ours to begin with. We can be like the Buddha—grounded, discerning, still. We can hold our clarity like a flame in a windstorm. When we stop reacting to every cruelty and begin responding from spiritual depth, we reclaim our sacred agency. This is not detachment: it's a strategic refusal to let chaos colonize our spirit. The revolution will not be reactive. It will be metabolically wise. Spiritually rooted. Discerning. Collective. Generous. Joyful. Courageous.

We are in this together.

Creation Care Corner

Leave the Leaves!

It's that time of year when many people are tempted to rake those leaves off their lawn. But there's a growing movement to "leave the leaves" for environmental reasons. Here's why:

The Benefits of leaving leaves

Wildlife support:

Leaf litter provides crucial overwintering habitat and a food source for many insects including butterflies and moths, amphibians, and other small animals, which in turn provides food for birds and other predators.

Environmental benefits:

Leaving leaves on your property reduces the need for leaf blowers and trucks, which saves energy and cuts down on greenhouse gas emissions. It also keeps a large amount of yard waste out of landfills, where it can produce methane.

Soil health:

As leaves decompose, they return nutrients to the soil, acting as a free, natural fertilizer and improving soil structure. They also increase moisture retention and aeration.

Natural mulch:

Leaves can be used as a free mulch for garden beds, which suppresses weeds, keeps the soil moist, and protects plant roots from winter damage.

How to leave your leaves

Mow and shred:

Use a mulching mower to chop up the leaves directly on your lawn. This is the most efficient way to turn them into a beneficial fertilizer that won't smother the grass.

or if you have little or no lawn....


Rake to garden beds:

Instead of removing leaves, rake them into your garden beds to use as a natural mulch. This is an effective way to protect plants through the winter.

Compost:

Add shredded leaves to your compost pile to create a nutrient-rich soil amendment for the next growing season.

Give nature a helping hand this fall and leave the leaves!


We Believe: A Choral Evensong



The Stained Glass is Back!

We are excited to announce that the three restored stained glass panels have been re-installed in the Cathedral! At the time of this writing, the only work left to be done is to install the protective glass panels on the outside of the windows. This glass will allow the windows to be protected, but will offer a clearer view of the beautiful colors and artistry than the "plexiglass" panels of old. We are close to reaching our fundraising goal to complete the payment for this work, but the next big project has already been identified: the even-larger panels that overlook the Memorial Garden on the opposite side of the cathedral. Highlights of the October 2025 Trinity Cathedral Vestry Meeting

Twelve of the fourteen members of the Trinity Cathedral Vestry along with a guest attendee, Lucy Adams, met via Zoom on Tuesday evening, October 21, at 6:30 pm. The Dean presided and called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm and offered the opening prayer. The main agenda items were as follows:

- <u>Financial Summary.</u> Treasurer Ron Zilinski presented a financial summary of the Cathedral's operations through September. Income, at \$579k, was 69% of the budgeted amount; while expenses were \$669k, 79% of the budgeted amount, driven by higher property and maintenance expenses. To date in 2025, \$100k has been drawn down from our Cathedral investments to manage operating cashflow.
- <u>Investments.</u> Canon Paul Cooper presented an estimated summary of the Cathedral's investments through August, which totaled \$2.74M, 7.6% more than at the end of 2024. The estimates will be updated with actual September figures from our *Diocesan Investment Trust* (DIT), *Dean Adams Trust* (DAT), Wells Fargo brokerage account, and Jane Ramsdell estate PSEG account information when available.
- <u>Property & Maintenance (P&M).</u> Senior Warden Gil Williams, reporting for P&M Chair Mike Raab, requested and was granted Vestry approval to spend \$5k on our stained-glass window repairs. This amount will be added to the \$5k being raised for these repairs from parish donations.
- <u>Food Pantry.</u> Lourdez Hernandez reported that *Mercer Street Friends* is reducing their allotment to the Food Pantry so we may need contributions from the Cathedral for Thanksgiving distributions.
- <u>Fund Raising.</u> Junior Warden Margaret Nartey shared that the African Festival will take place from 7-11pm on Saturday, October 25. The Dean shared that the Community Day Golf Outing took place on Monday, October 20, and was a success after being rescheduled from October 13 due to unfavorable weather.
- <u>Dean's Report.</u> The Dean reported that: a) he is grateful for the Celebration events that have taken place in the Cathedral this Fall in appreciation of our choir, clergy, and volunteers; b) the Diocesan Convention will take place at Christ Church, Toms River, on Saturday, November 22; and c) a Cathedral committee will be established to evaluate a potential solar project after receiving a proposal from Energyware.
- <u>Old and New Business</u>. Ron and Gil will follow up with the Post Office to attempt to recover the money from the last outstanding stolen check in 2023. Gil is working with Lee Whiteman to investigate QR code capability for online donations during our Livestreamed services.
- Next Meeting. The next meeting will be that of the Major Chapter on Tuesday, November 18, at 6:30 pm via Zoom.
- Closing Prayer. Gil offered the closing prayer, and the meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm.



This year's winners include industry powerhouses such as Pixar Animation Studios, Hearst Media, ESPN, LinkedIn, NASA, and MTV Entertainment Studios. "Our industry is experimenting with new technologies like never before, shaping truly compelling stories," says Telly Awards Managing Director Amanda Needham. "The Telly Awards is uniquely positioned to meet the industry where it's actually making work, be that on television or TikTok."

Selected from thousands of global entries, Whiteman's work on the David Yurman holiday campaign stood out for its vibrant cinematic style, sharp storytelling, and massive impact across social media platforms. Created in collaboration with director Anton Lombardi, the campaign featured an all-star cast including Academy Award nominee Sterling K. Brown, Iris Law, Hero Fiennes Tiffin, Arizona Muse, Winnie Harlow, and basketball star Kyle Kuzma.

Spanning 29 high-impact videos, the campaign blended glamorous visuals with candid interviews, playful trivia, and behind-the-scenes content. Daily celebrity drops helped sustain momentum throughout the holiday season, generating over 10 million impressions and garnering a feature in The Hollywood Reporter.


