A Reading from the Second letter of Peter (2 Peter 1:16-21)

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, “This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.” We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one’s own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

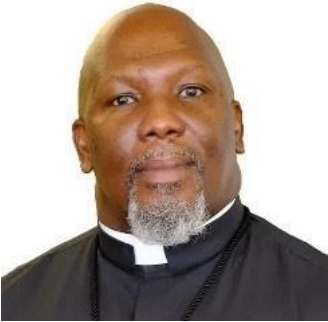

WE WELCOME OUR GUEST PREACHER, REV. CN. RICARDO W. SHEPPARD



The Rev. Canon Ricardo W. Sheppard serves as Canon for Discipleship in the Diocese of Virginia, where he works alongside clergy and lay leaders to deepen faith formation, cultivate discipleship, and strengthen congregational life across the diocese. His ministry centers on helping individuals and communities discern how God is calling them to grow, serve, and be faithful disciples of Christ.

Born in Trinidad and Tobago and raised in Brooklyn, New York, Canon Sheppard served honorably for over nine years in the United States Marine Corps before discerning a call to ordained ministry. Prior to entering the Episcopal Church, he served in youth and outreach ministry at Hebron Baptist Church in Brooklyn, where his love for preaching, teaching, and pastoral care was first nurtured. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Social Science from the College of New Rochelle, a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary, and a Diploma in Anglican Studies from the University of the South (Sewanee).

Canon Sheppard has served as Priest-in-Charge of St. Albans Episcopal Church in New Jersey and as Rector of The Episcopal Church of the Atonement in Washington, DC, before being called to diocesan leadership. He remains deeply committed to equipping lay people for ministry, proclaiming the Gospel with clarity and hope.

It is especially meaningful for him to return to Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, the parish from which he was received and ordained, to preach at this service honoring The Very Rev. Rene Rory John, whose leadership and ministry have shaped him, Trinity Cathedral, the Trenton community and the wider church.

WE WELCOME JUANITA FAULKNER, OUR GUEST MUSICIAN



Juanita Faulkner, soprano, was born and raised in East Elmhurst, NY. Having studied with several renowned coaches of the Metropolitan Opera and other operatic venues, she is a much in demand concert artist. She has toured the United States extensively, performed in city parks and plazas throughout New England, the midwest, the South and California. Her New York appearances include several performances at the Lincoln Center, Cami Hall and Symphony Space. Her international credits include Italy, Greece, Turkey, Switzerland, Canada, Nigeria and the Caribbean Islands.

Critics have described Juanita's voice as the 'perfect Verdi instrument. Her vocal interpretations of Verdi's most celebrated heroines Aida, Lenora ("La Forza Del Destino") and Amelia ("Un Ballo in Maschera") are said by many to be amongst the finest of today's artists.
