The Reverend Canon Terence Alexander Lee: Biography

The Reverend Canon Terence Alexander Lee most recently served as the Priest-In-Charge of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in South River, New Jersey. His tenure in this role was preceded by his appointment as the 10th Rector of The Historic St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Harlem, NY, where he served from 2018 to 2023. Prior to that, Fr. Lee was the Rector of St. Gabriel's Episcopal Church in Hollis, NY, within the Diocese of Long Island, from 2010 to 2018. His inspirational leadership and nurturing presence in these parishes earned him recognition for his positive influence as a spiritual leader. Notably, he was appointed by the bishop as Priest-in-Charge of St. John's Episcopal Church in Springfield Gardens, NY, while continuing his service at St. Gabriel's, reflecting his capacity to guide multiple congregations simultaneously.

Fr. Lee is a member of the Diocesan Council for the Diocese of New Jersey. He has also been appointed to the Reparative Justice Task Force, highlighting his ongoing commitment to justice and equality within the church community. His dedication to the church's broader mission is further demonstrated through active collaborations with a variety of Community Based Organizations and initiatives throughout New York City. These partnerships underscore his efforts to foster community engagement and advance the church's mission beyond parish boundaries. Fr. Lee's collaborative work included engagement with the National Black Leadership Commission on Health and participation in New York City's Taskforce on Racial Inclusion and Equity (TRIE).

In addition to his regional responsibilities, Fr. Lee serves as the convener of the National Chaplains for The Order of the Daughters of the King. In this capacity, he supports the spiritual growth and guidance of the organization's members, fostering unity and purpose among chaplains nationwide. Internationally, Fr. Lee is recognized as a Canon in the Cathedral of the Anglican Diocese of Wiawso, Ghana, West Africa, where he has both served and preached. His previous roles include service as Canon Pastor of The Cathedral of St. John in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and as Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Bennettsville, South Carolina.

Fr. Lee is a graduate of Nashotah House Seminary in Delafield, Wisconsin, where he was recognized as a Chapel Scholar. He brings to his ministry a diverse set of specialized gifts and skills, including preaching, spiritual formation, pastoral care and counseling, church administration, church growth, community involvement, and conflict resolution.

A resolute educator, Fr. Lee has served as an Elementary School Teacher in South Carolina, teaching Kindergarten as well as 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades. His role as a spiritual counselor and advisor is further highlighted by his work with The Children's Defense Fund, a leading children's advocacy organization.

Fr. Lee's service extends to chaplaincy, having served as Chaplain for the Bennettsville, SC Police Department and Rotary Club International. He has also held the position of Vice President of the Board of Camp DeWolfe, the Diocese of Long Island's camp and conference retreat center, where he played a role in transforming camp fundraising and participation. Additionally, he served as Chaplain of the Alpha Gamma Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., of which he is a committed member. His ministry is distinguished by a keen awareness of the wider church community, a passion for liturgy and worship, and a deep commitment to community activism and social outreach.

A native of Charleston, South Carolina, Fr. Lee holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education, with a certification in Early Childhood Education from the College of Charleston. He enjoys music, traveling, reading, and golfing. Fr. Lee is married to the Reverend Violet L.D. Lee, Ph.D., who serves as Chaplain and Teacher of Religion and Philosophy at The Lawrenceville School. Together, they are the proud parents of two children, Gabrielle and Noah.

Trinity Cathedral Participates in World Labyrinth Day, Saturday May 2, 2026



The Cathedral Arts Series at Trinity announces that Trinity Cathedral will join the annual World Labyrinth Day (Saturday, May 2) during which thousands of people participate in a walk of local labyrinths in communities across the globe. Those attending the event at Trinity Cathedral will have the opportunity to walk two different labyrinths on the front lawn of the Cathedral along West State Street.

Maria LoBiondo, a well-known storyteller, and labyrinth guide will facilitate the labyrinth walk. The afternoon will begin at 12:30 PM with a brief presentation by LoBiondo about labyrinths, their history, and contemporary use. Then at 1PM, joining with thousands of others across the world—in an effort called, “Walk as One at One”—participants will be invited to walk their choice of labyrinths at their own pace.

Participants are encouraged to bring water and snacks to sustain themselves. Cathedral restrooms will be available for those who need them. Brochures describing the labyrinths and suggestions for making them part of one’s meditative or introspective moments will be available. Ample parking is available in the Cathedral’s parking lot behind the building as well as along local streets.

The permanent labyrinth at Trinity Cathedral (pictured above) was installed as part of an Eagle Scout project more than 20 years ago and has served as meditation device since. Its design is modelled after a medieval labyrinth found in the Basilica of San Vitale in Ravenna, Italy. Trinity Cathedral’s permanent labyrinth is open 24 hours daily throughout the year.

The second labyrinth will be installed on the front lawn specifically for this event. Its diameter is approximately 50 feet and its design is known as a processional labyrinth that offers two entrances allowing walkers to pass others travelling in a different direction. Internationally known labyrinth installer Lars Howlett designed the labyrinth. The temporary processional labyrinth will remain in place through Memorial Day weekend (May 26th) or until conditions necessitate its removal.

People, ancient cultures, and traditions have used spiral and labyrinth designs as symbols of their search for meaning and guidance. A labyrinth is a "unicursal" or one path design—there are no tricks, no decisions to make—just follow the path. The labyrinth is non-denominational. People of all faiths and people longing to re-connect to faith or seeking personal reflection, come to walk labyrinths.

Some of the earliest forms of labyrinths are found in Greece, dating back to 2500-2000 B.C.E. Labyrinths were such a major part of the fabric of early societies that they were frequently embossed on coins and pottery and carved into church walls. Early Christian labyrinths date back to 4th century including one discovered in a basilica in Algeria. One of the most famous is the labyrinth laid into the cathedral floor at Chartres, France in the thirteenth century. The Chartres design is a classical eleven-circuit labyrinth (eleven concentric circles) with the twelfth being in the center of the labyrinth. During the middle ages, labyrinths were sometimes used as a local substitute to making a pilgrimage to a holy site to avoid the dangers of ongoing conflicts or the risks of walking through areas where safety was not assured.

Highlights of the March 2026 Trinity Cathedral Vestry Meeting

Ten of the Twelve members of the Trinity Cathedral Vestry met via Zoom on Monday evening, March 16, at 6:30 pm. Senior Warden Gil Williams presided and called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm and offered the opening prayer. The main agenda items were as follows:

Financial Summary. Treasurer Ron Zilinski presented the latest 2026 Cathedral budget totaling \$953.5k, an increase of \$111.2k over 2025 driven by interim clergy salary as well as higher property and maintenance expenses. Ron also shared a financial summary of the Cathedral's operations through February, noting that we currently have 74 pledge units from the congregation. Actual income and expenses will be presented at the next Vestry meeting.

Investments. Ron also presented an estimated summary of the Cathedral's investments through February, which totaled \$2.739M. \$1.045M of the total is invested in *Diocesan Investment Trust* (DIT) funds, an estimated \$1.1M of the total is under the management of the trustees of the *Dean Adams Trust* (DAT), \$494.5k is in the Wells Fargo brokerage account, and the remaining estimated \$99.5k is a bequest by the estate of Jane Ramsdell in PSEG stock. The Cathedral still has not received an estimated remaining \$109k bequest from Dr. Fred Rogers' estate.

Property & Maintenance (P&M). Gil reported for *P&M* Chair Mike Raab and shared that repairs for the gutter damaged in the February winter storm are underway. *P&M* recommends repairing the stained glass overlooking the Memorial garden at an estimate of \$124k and will suggest a timeline at the next meeting. John Gummere and La'Tonya Johnson will explore grant applications for Cathedral maintenance purposes with organizations including the National Fund for Sacred Places and the Order of the Daughters of the King.

Food Pantry. Lourdez Hernandez shared that the Food Pantry is serving about 200 families each month and recently shared 60 excess bags of food with the Eastern Service Workers Association.

Fund Raising. Junior Warden Margaret Nartey shared that the Cathedral Fashion Show is scheduled for May 9. La'Tonya shared that the Annual Community Day Golf Outing will take place on October 12.

Old and New Business. As a result of the retirement from the Vestry of Canon Dr. Paul Cooper, Gil will solicit replacement candidates from the congregation. Gil will also share that the Vestry will host two Cathedral Leadership Transition meetings with the congregation: one on April 12 (in-person after the 10am service) and the second on April 19 (Zoom in the afternoon).

Next Meeting. The next meeting will be that of the Minor Chapter on Monday, April 20, at 6:30 pm via Zoom.

Closing Prayer and Blessing. Canon Dr. Phil Lewis offered the closing prayer, and the meeting adjourned at 8:49 pm.

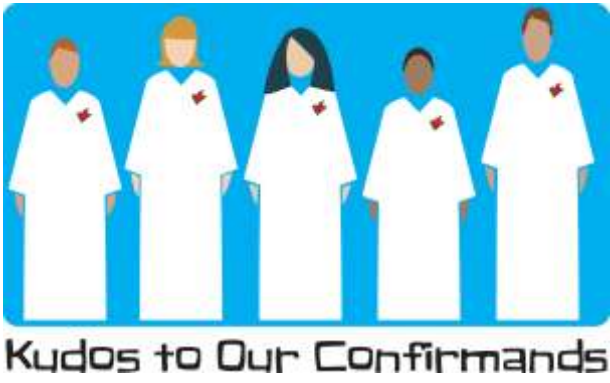

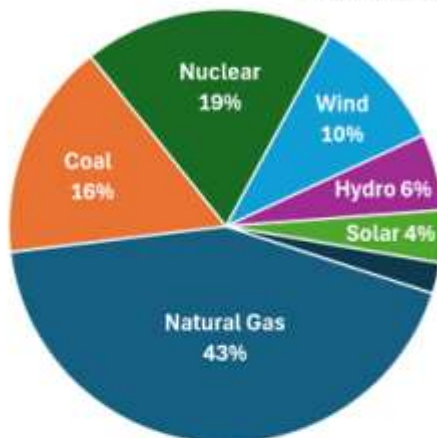

Creation Care Corner

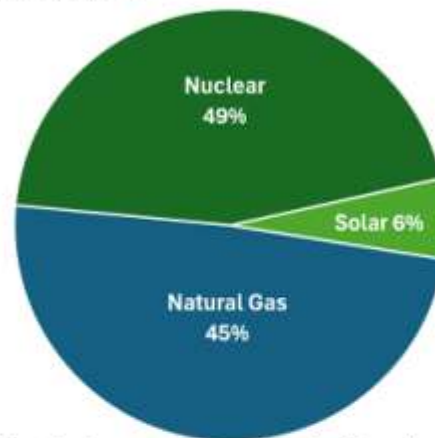
Earth Day April 22, 2026

Since its inception in 1970, Earth Day on April 22nd has been an annual event to demonstrate support for environmental protection. The theme this year is "Our Power, Our Planet". A frequently voiced solution for reducing our carbon footprint is to "electrify everything". So with Earth Day in mind, Trinity Cathedral's Creation Care team researched how our electrical power is generated in the US, and in New Jersey in particular.

How is our electricity generated?

Electrical power generation in New Jersey: Regional Plan Association, 2024-25 data.

The pie chart on the left shows power generation for the whole US, which has a higher reliance on fossil fuels than many developed countries, especially European nations. The news is a little better for New Jersey, (right chart). We take advantage of carbon-free generating capacity from the Salem and Hope Creek nuclear stations in Salem County, and there are ambitious proposals (currently on hold) for offshore windfarms that will significantly boost our renewable generation. Solar power generation has also been increasing in the state. This is encouraging news if we want more clean power to "electrify everything".

How can we make a difference?

Americans consume around 12 MWh per capita of electricity annually, which is nearly four times the global average. Here are some ways we can use less: Change to LED lights; turn the thermostat up/down in summer/winter; seal home air leaks; check your house insulation and upgrade if necessary; reduce the temperature of your clothes wash and run full loads; air dry clothes when possible and clean the dryer lint filter regularly; replace those old inefficient appliances; turn off unnecessary lights, (including outside); turn off electronics when not in use; get an energy audit! (Phew!)

Finally, as people of faith we have a responsibility to advocate for a better future for all people, not just ourselves. If your local, state and Federal government representatives are ignoring climate change or think it's a hoax, - then reach out and tell them you care. Your voice matters.

The group facilitators recently shared some photos from an Art Therapy session they held one recent Saturday. Art therapy for grief provides a non-verbal, creative outlet to process complex emotions like anger, guilt, and sorrow, using materials such as clay, paint, and collage to externalize pain. It helps individuals honor the deceased, find new meaning in loss, and reduce feelings of isolation. Art acts as a container for overwhelming feelings, providing a structured, safe space to release tension without needing to verbalize pain.

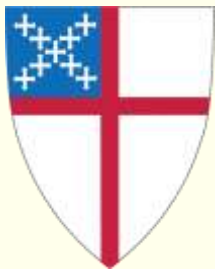
