## Greetings from the Acting Dean

Beloved in Christ, have you ever pondered the question, “Does God take a vacation?”

As we approach the end of the school year and the beginning of summer, many of us are looking forward to some time away. There is often a sense of anticipation and gratitude as we prepare to rest with family, gather with friends, or simply enjoy a quieter pace. For some, rest may come at the Jersey Shore, on a Caribbean island, or in the mountains. Others may find joy in amusement parks, national parks, or returning home to visit loved ones. However we spend these summer days, they offer us a gracious opportunity to be renewed in body, mind,

and spirit.

Martha’s Vineyard is my happy place. I cherish being there with family and friends—walking along the beach, grilling outdoors, and settling into the slower rhythm of “island time.” Those who live on or visit the island know something of its quiet mystique. Because there is no bridge, one must arrive by plane or ferry, and that journey itself can feel like an invitation to leave behind the hurry of daily life. Another gift of the island is its local character. The restaurants and shops are not the familiar chains we see everywhere else, but places with their own stories and personalities. And almost inevitably, you see someone you know—or someone who knows someone you know. The human connection is real, and it is a reminder of how deeply we are created for community. I often wish every person could know the blessing of rest in a place they love, surrounded by people who bring them joy.

Most of us welcome the chance to take a vacation, to step away from responsibilities, to breathe more deeply, and to be restored. But the question remains: “Does God take a vacation?” The answer is no. We take time away because we grow tired. We need rest because our bodies, minds, and spirits need renewal. But God does not grow weary. God does not withdraw from us. God does not need to step away from the needs of creation. The One who is all-powerful, all-knowing, and ever-present remains faithfully attentive to us in every season of life.

Yes, in the book of Genesis we read that God “rested” on the seventh day. Yet this rest is not because God was exhausted; rather, it reveals the holy rhythm of creation. God’s Sabbath rest teaches us that rest is sacred, necessary, and life-giving. It is a gift entrusted to us. The prophet

With great joy and thanksgiving, the Diocese of New Jersey celebrated the ordination of Angela DiJoseph, Kimme Carlos, Tiffany Campbell, and Gregory Geehern to the Sacred Order of Deacons on Saturday, June 20, at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Trenton.

More than 250 people gathered for the occasion, including clergy from across the diocese and a diocesan-wide choir that helped lead the congregation in worship. Family members, friends, parishioners, and supporters filled the Cathedral to witness and celebrate this important milestone in the life of the Church. Angela, Kimme, Tiffany, and Gregory will now serve as transitional deacons as they continue preparing for ordination to the priesthood.

Deacons hold a distinctive role in the life of the Church, serving as a bridge between the Church and the world and calling God's people to lives of service, compassion, and justice. Through their ministry, they remind the Church of Christ's mission among those who are most vulnerable and marginalized. While some are called to a lifelong vocation as deacons, the diaconate is also the first order of ordained ministry for those preparing to become priests. Every priest and bishop remains grounded in the vows first made as a deacon, carrying forward the deacon's call to servant ministry throughout their ordained life.

The Diocese of New Jersey gives thanks to God for these four new deacons, for the communities that have formed and supported them, and for the ministries to which God has called them. Please keep our newly ordained deacons—Angela DiJoseph, Kimme Carlos, Tiffany Campbell, and Gregory Geehern—in your prayers as they begin this next chapter of ordained ministry.

## Highlights of the May 2026 Major Chapter Meeting of Trinity Cathedral

Twenty of the 26 members of the Major Chapter of Trinity Cathedral met via Zoom on Tuesday evening, May 19, at 6:30 pm. The Bishop called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and offered the opening prayer. The main agenda items were as follows:

Welcoming the Acting Dean. The Major Chapter members welcomed our Acting Dean, Rev. Terence Lee.

Financial Summary. Treasurer Ron Zilinski presented a financial summary of the Cathedral's operations as of May 17. Income was \$242.8k, while expenses were \$337.4k, resulting in -\$94.5k net income. Property and maintenance expenses have totaled \$98.2k to date, driving the higher expenses. Ron will share the updated financial results of the Cathedral's 2026 operations through the end of May with the Major Chapter members when available. Father Lee and Ron will plan for an audit of the Cathedral's finances before September 1.

Investment Report. Ron also presented an estimated summary of the Cathedral's investments through March, which totaled \$2.6M. \$995.5k of the total is invested in *Diocesan Investment Trust* (DIT) funds, an estimated \$1.037M of the total is under the management of the trustees of the *Dean Adams Trust* (DAT), an estimated \$506k is in the Wells Fargo brokerage account, and the estimated remaining \$94.8k is a bequest by the estate of Jane Ramsdell in PSEG stock. The Cathedral still has not received an estimated remaining \$109k bequest from Dr. Fred Rogers' estate. Ron will share the updated investment report through May with the Major Chapter members when available.

Property & Maintenance (P&M). Father Lee reported for P&M Chair Mike Raab and shared that the Cathedral is assessing a \$400k estimate for organ repairs. The boiler recently completed routine maintenance repairs totaling \$4k.

Fund Raising. Junior Warden Margaret Nartey shared that the May 9 Cathedral *Fashion Show* was successful and raised about \$4k. The Annual *Community Day Golf Outing* will take place on October 12 and save-the-dates have been sent out.

Bishop's Report. Bishop French reported that she is working with Father Lee to center the Cathedral in Diocesan life. On Saturday, May 30, the Cathedral will host a Diocesan-wide Confirmation service; and on Saturday, June 20, the Cathedral will host the Ordinations to the Sacred Order of Deacons. Diocesan Convention is planned to be held at the Cathedral as well. The Cathedral undercroft crypt has been experiencing water moisture issues, and the Diocesan Council will support the remediation.

Dean's Report. Father Lee shared his gratitude for the opportunity to serve as Acting Dean of the Cathedral. Over his first weeks, he has focused on building relationships and getting to know parishioners, listening and learning about parish life, observing daily cathedral operations and staff roles, and beginning to identify immediate needs and short-term goals for the next 90 days as we move into the summer months. He sent in his report with the highlights as follows:

**Initial Priorities and Approach.** His immediate priorities include ensuring continuity in worship, pastoral care, and daily operations. He is meeting individually with clergy, staff, wardens, and ministry leaders; and listening to parishioners and stakeholders regarding hopes, concerns, and aspirations. He hopes to have a Vestry and Major Chapter retreat at end of summer / early fall, and Parish retreat. He is reviewing current operational, financial, and programmatic realities, as well as strengthening communication and collaborative leadership. His primary goal during these first few weeks has been to provide calm, visible, and steady leadership while gaining a fuller understanding of the cathedral's life and culture.

**Worship and Pastoral Life.** He notes that the worship life of the Cathedral remains strong and central to our common mission. He has been encouraged by the commitment of clergy, musicians, liturgical ministers,

ushers, and volunteers who are a vital part of the Cathedral's ministry. He has been available to parishioners after service and during coffee hour, participated in the Fashion show, and attended and prayed with leaders of the "Free Clothing Closet" event.

**Staff and Leadership.** He has met with all members of the Cathedral staff and has begun building collaborative working relationships across areas of ministry and administration. Several themes have emerged from these early conversations: desire for clear communication and expectations, and the need for regular staff meetings. All lay leaders need to be trained including Altar Guild, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, Acolytes; and all Staff and those with Cathedral keys need Safe Church training. There is a need to balance immediate operational demands with longer-term vision, and interest in renewed energy around Cathedral identity and mission. His vision is to foster a culture of collegiality, accountability, transparency, and mutual support.

**Operations and Administration.** In these first weeks, he has reviewed all Cathedral contracts and administrative processes. He is also reviewing building and facilities concerns along with administrative workflows/staffing needs. While this review is ongoing, it is already clear that the Cathedral possesses significant strengths alongside several operational challenges that will require thoughtful prioritization and shared leadership.

**Community Presence and Cathedral Identity.** As the Cathedral church of the Diocese, Trinity occupies a unique role both in the diocese and the city of Trenton. Early conversations suggest an ardent desire to deepen the cathedral's visibility, accessibility, and public witness in the Diocese of New Jersey, Trenton and the wider region. There is meaningful opportunity to strengthen relationships with diocesan leadership and congregations, expand community engagement and partnerships, clarify and communicate the cathedral's mission and identity, build renewed momentum around hospitality, formation, and outreach (2030 will celebrate centennial). These conversations are still emerging, but they reflect substantial energy and goodwill.

**Observations and Encouragements.** Among the most encouraging aspects of these opening weeks have been the faithfulness and resilience of the congregation, deep commitment among lay leaders and volunteers, pride in the cathedral's history and mission, and a genuine desire for healthy collaboration and renewal. Transitions naturally bring uncertainty, but they also create opportunities for reflection, growth, and re-centering around mission.

**Next Steps.** In the coming weeks, he plans to focus on continued listening and relationship-building, clarifying short-term operational priorities, strengthening internal communication, supporting staff coordination and ministry planning, identifying realistic opportunities for growth and renewal, and working collaboratively with Vestry and Major Chapter leadership on emerging priorities.

Next Meeting. The next Major Chapter meeting will be on Tuesday, September 15, 2026, at 6:30 pm via Zoom.

Closing Prayer and Blessing. The Bishop offered the closing prayer and then gave her blessing. The meeting adjourned at 8:08 pm.

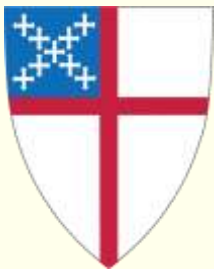
